CAMBRIDGE SPORTS LAKE: PLANTING SCHEDULE

- 1. DOMINANT WOODLAND MIX (Oak - Ash)**
Locally occurring native species link site into the surrounding landscape

Oak	Quercus robur
Field maple	Acer campestre
Hazel	Corylus avellana
Birch	Betula pendula
Lime	Tilia cordata
Spruce	Picea abies
- 2. SUB-DOMINANT WOODLAND MIX (Ash - Maple)**
Provides habitat diversity across the site

- 3. MOUND TOP**
Species able to cope with drier exposed conditions

- 4. WATER'S EDGE PLANTING**
Creates a diverse and habitat rich waterside environment in the Country Park

- 5. CONIFEROUS WATERSIDE PLANTING**
Provides a wind break with limited leaf fall into the Competition Lake

- 6. HEDGEROWS**
Linear screen linking site into surrounding landscape and habitat matrix

- 7. FOCAL SPECIMEN CLUMPS**
Single specimen stands planted at strategic points within the Country Park provide seasonal focal interest

- 8. MARGINAL PLANTING**
Softens the edges of the Storage Lake, provides seasonal interest and a range of edge habitats in the surrounding ditches and drainage channels
